We are delighted to announce that Masyn Evans-Clements has been hired as our permanent Minister for Youth and Outreach, effective June 1, 2020. Masyn has served in the interim role since October 2019. Masyn will remain part-time as she finishes her Master of Divinity, expecting to graduate next summer.

Much gratitude to the Associate Pastor Search Committee who continued the search during this time of quarantine. It's been difficult but they have continued to meet virtually and do the work they were called to do. Thank you Abby Byrd, Kade Keith, Courtney Morton, Edna Nation, and Hannah Neas.

The Church Council voted unanimously on May 17, 2020 to accept the Search Committee's proposal and expressed nothing but total support of their decision. The Council as a whole was very complimentary of the work Masyn has been doing thus far and are excited about what the future brings with Masyn on our staff.

It's rather hard to wrap my mind around the fact that it's been 12 weeks since we closed the doors of the church building and took the church out into Austin. I remember the day we made the decision we thought were talking about a couple of weeks, a month at the most. The staff jumped in immediately and came up with ways to do worship, stay in contact, work from home and make sure The Church @ Highland Park was still "doing church" as we were called to do. You, the church, also jumped in and accepted the situation with grace and love and did what you needed to do make this work.

We have all (mostly) learned how to do Zoom meetings and Walt Shelton volunteered to do an Adult Sunday School class. Masyn worked with the youth to create a Zoom class for them every Sunday morning. The Balkums moved their Young Couples class to a Zoom meeting on weeknights and now Rachel is starting a class on Wednesday nights studying early American hymns. Kay Greenhaw has shown us that one of her many talents is editing our home-recorded videos into beautiful services each Sunday. Many have agreed to share their gifts of music or words of wisdom in our Sunday services. Many of you are sending notes, emails, and texts to one another. Our social media page has been active and fun. The Church @ Highland Park is continuing to stay connected and we're learning and growing and staying connected.

I guess the biggest thing on most people's mind is....When do get to go back to the building? When can we see one another face-to-face? When can we worship together in one place? I wish I could answer those questions. The Council is united in their vision of bringing the church back together when we can be confident that we aren't putting anyone in danger.

I've talked to many other pastors, I've read what the CDC recommends, and I've talked to churches that have opened their doors back up. Some have begun services with major changes, some are planning to open in September or October, others not until 2021. We are all very aware that when we do return we will need to make some changes. We will need to spread out; we will need to keep distance

between us; we will probably need to wear masks. We may need to make changes to our service and we will need to think how to best keep ourselves and our children safe.

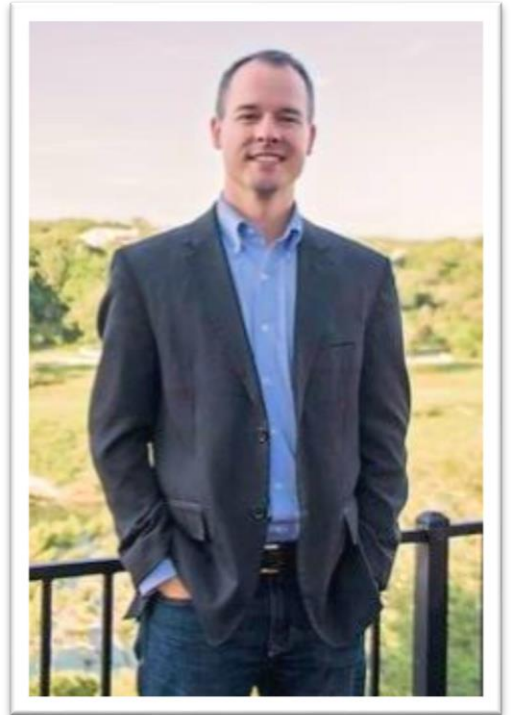

Here are a few items to mention:

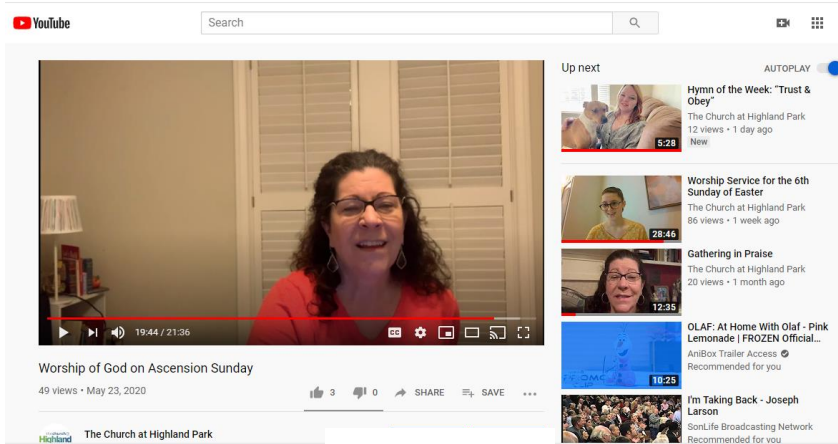

Christian Education Service Group

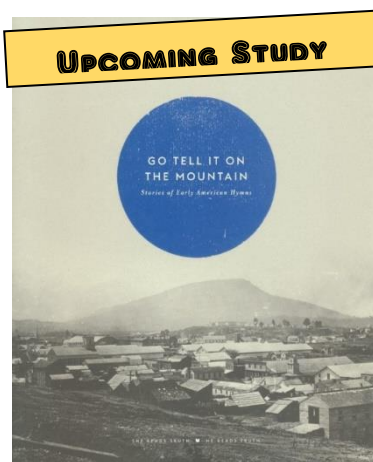

Walt Shelton will continue to lead a **Sunday School class over the Zoom platform** each Sunday morning, typically at 10 a.m. **Please note: classes on June 14 and 21 will be at 11 a.m.** Our next topics will include: (1) "Coping with Unexpected and Other Seasons of Life," in part utilizing Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 and Mark 1:35-38, as well as discussing the importance of daily and other periodic routines to stay focused and live out our priorities; and (2) "How many times did or does Jesus have to come for his followers to 'get it'?" We will use a variety of passages here, including Mark 13, I Cor. 15, parts of I and II Thessalonians, and parts of some of the Gospels' Easter narratives. 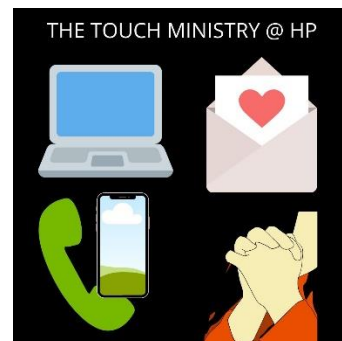

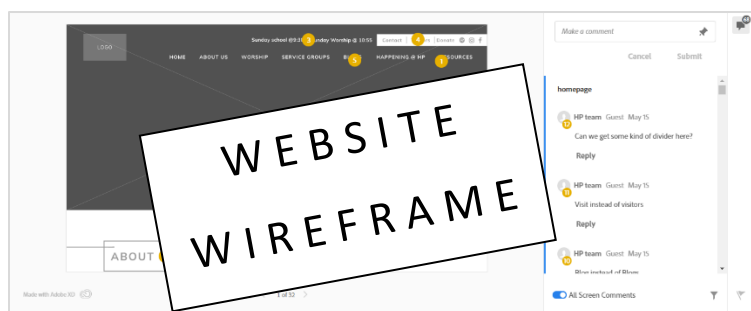

Outreach & Communication Service Group

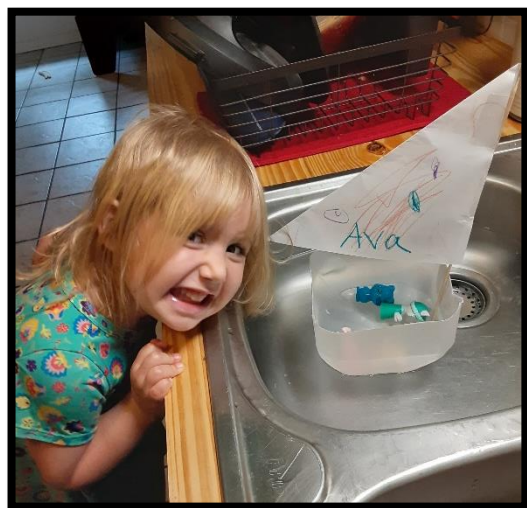

Ava Byrd and her milk jug boat for the Noah's ark study.

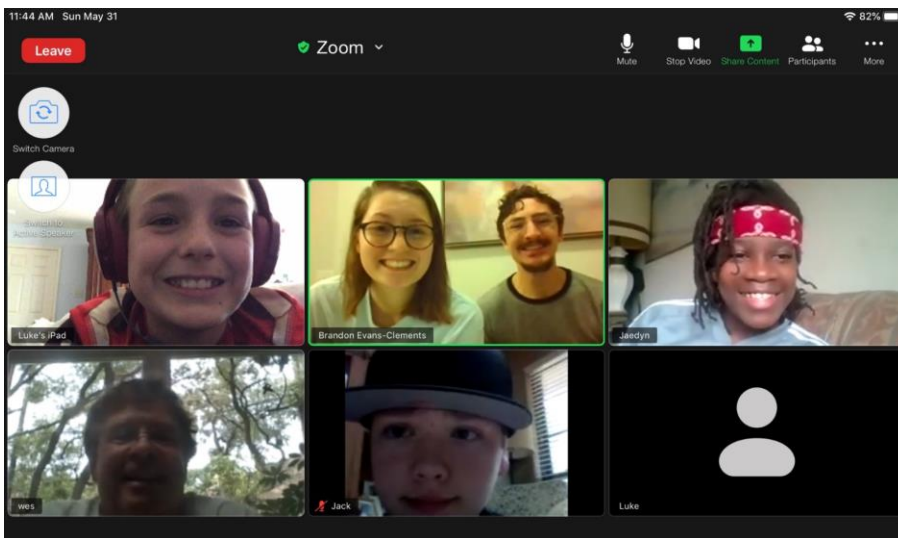

The building's janitor, Angel Perez, has been working tirelessly inside and outside building to get things in tip-top shape for the eventual return. Angel has stripped and waxed all tile flooring, including the school areas, Nursery, Sapp Hall, Atrium, and second floor. Everything looks shiny and spectacular! Angel has also washed windows and disinfected toys and surfaces, with plans for additional projects over the summer.



Becky and Don Dillard have overseen a few repairs to the building during this time. The power to the front sign was redistributed, a broken breaker box cover was repaired, an office upstairs was repainted, and the roof was replaced on the two back buildings. Cheryl and Becky have also worked hard to finish some organization projects in the building, particularly in the Worship closet in the basement and establishing an office for Abby and Masyn to share upstairs.

The grounds are also being maintained even though gatherings are not taking place indoors. Members and parents of Troop 410 have a socially-distant schedule for taking care of the grounds, alternating with a once-a-month lawn service provided by Paragon.

At the end of April, the Personnel Service Group oversaw the renewal of health benefits that some employees receive. In May, they oversaw Masyn's change to permanent hire (part-time for now, potentially become full time next year).

**Thank you for your faithful contributions.
Big or small, your gifts matter.**

Although our building has been closed, much has continued at The Church at Highland Park. The staff has been going to check on mail, messages, preparing updates and lessons for children, youth and adults. Presenting us with beautiful services and mid-week studies and working hard to keep us engaged.

The janitors have used this time to do much deep cleaning. We have continued to pay every employee.

We received a Payroll Protection Plan (PPP) loan/grant which allowed us to pay all of our employees salaried and hourly for 8 weeks. This loan should be forgiven since it was used for authorized expenses.

Paragon Prep has asked for a possible reduction in their lease payment, in the event they have a reduction in the number of students next school year. The council has addressed this with an addendum to the lease that will allow them to lower the lease payment as much as 15% tied to the number of students enrolled. Our other tenant is a restaurant business and could be affected by the COVID-19 situation. They have not requested any change in the lease payment.

The budget this year was very intentionally setup for us to manage the income received by leasing our building to cover the expenses of managing the building and grounds, while continuing to fund most of our Personnel and all of our Ministry Programs and Missions through member contributions. There is a difficulty in this reporting because a great deal of both ministerial and office staff time is required in the management of both the building and tenants. We will work on a way to divide Personnel costs to even the costs.



Update from our Community

Paragon Prep held a socially-distant, drive-thru graduation ceremony on Friday, May 22, 2020, to honor their graduating 8th graders. Families drove around the parking lot with their graduate inside before going home to watch a pre-recorded video that was posted on YouTube. The teachers were encouraged to park spaced around the lot and hold up posters congratulating the students, and the administrators stood by the main entrance.

All cheered as the families drove by. As each graduate passed, the Paragon gong was rung, a tradition of the school, which warns Austin area high schools that a Paragon knight is on the way!
