Notes from the March Ministry Council Meeting

Rev. Cheryl Kimble gave a brief report on three-day retreat at Royal Lane Baptist Church attended by Cheryl, Nancy Osgood, and Alana Mallard, and sponsored by Alliance of Baptists' Compassionate Congregations and Human Difference Initiative to help congregations walk through LGBTQ issues. Cheryl called it a spiritual and emotional and moving three days that she thinks will help us as we think about same-sex marriage and inclusiveness. Cheryl will attend a meeting in early April at Wilshire Baptist Church sponsored by Cooperative Baptist Fellowship specifically for progressive Baptist churches.

The Worship Ministry always welcomes people to help as seasons change. They are enjoying having Josh Miller as music director, and his MARS – Monthly After Rehearsal Social.

The Missions Ministry is planning a Day of Service for May 15 (see the article for more information).

The Outreach and Communication Ministry is looking to develop a consistent communication plan for every event at HPBC, even routine events such as Wednesday fellowship and Sunday worship. They are planning to revitalize our social media strategies, begin some practical outreach such as at apartment complexes, school outreach, revitalization of visitor program, post-Easter Service follow-up, and an inreach program to check in with our members.

Family Life and Fellowship reported several events planned for the summer and fall, including a hymn sing in June and the J.O.Y. & Co. trip to Yellowstone. (See back page for more summer dates.)

Joe Stafford reminds us about purchasing the dishwasher as the lease is up and the \$2150 purchase price would pay for itself. They discussed putting Financial Report in worship bulletin each month. Finance Ministry has a vacancy to fill—speak to Becky Dillard if you are interested.

Christian Education has the Faith and Film series scheduled for April 3, April 17, and May 4 at 5:30 p.m. The Elementary Sunday School Department is excited about having a copy machine downstairs.

The Servant Ministry noted that it is becoming hard to get people to commit to serving communion and hard to get ministers on call for a week at a time. They discussed setting up a sign-up board in the Atrium much as we did with IHN for people to volunteer. The sign-up board could also add greeters, God's Family Dinner, Micah 6, etc.
