SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR Children & Youth Children

Pre-elementary children go directly to the Nursery at 9:30 a.m.

9:30 A.M. OPENING ASSEMBLY

Opening Assembly for school-age children meets in our first floor Multi-Purpose room, Room 134.

9:45 A.M. SUNDAY SCHOOL

Following Opening Assembly, the school-age children dismiss to their Sunday School classes to continue the lesson through age-appropriate activities. We are currently using the "Deep Blue" Sunday School literature from Cokesbury.

10:30 A.M. CHILDREN'S CHOIR

The HPBC Children's Choir meets in the children's Multi-Purpose room (Room 134) with Courtney Morton. This is time for us to sing, dance, and worship, even with all of our wiggles! Then we all walk together to the Sanctuary to chime in the hour.

10:55 A.M. WORSHIP

The school-age children are invited to the 10:55 a.m. church service, where our older kids assist with carrying elements like the Christ Candle or Gospel Book. Following the Children's Sermon, children younger than 3rd grade are dismissed to the first floor Nursery area. We invite 3rd graders and older to stay in worship with the adults for the remainder of the service.

YOUth

The youth group includes students in grades 6 through 12.

9:30 A.M. SUNDAY SCHOOL

The youth group meets in the Underground on Sundays. We often start with bagels and juice, turn to our stories, prayer, and scripture. It's a great way to start the week and deepen our faith.

10:55 A.M. WORSHIP

Join us on the unofficial "youth pew" for worship each Sunday! Every summer, the church gives us an entire worship service to plan, prepare, preach, pray, read, and lead. It's a real gift and one we don't take lightly. This year, Youth-Led Sunday is August 7.
