It won't surprise most of you that getting to be "Grammy" to Blaine, Keller, Maggie and June is one of the best parts of my life. God calling me to Highland Park was also a call to my family, both the Kimble Family and the Highland Park family.

I think about the ways Highland Park has lifted me up and supported me through these 18 years and it brings both tears and laughter. You've helped me spread my wings in ways I never dreamed possible. To think I preach almost every Sunday still amazes me, but your support and encouragement allowed God to equip me for such work. You've also held me up through the loss of both of my parents, my sister and other family losses. I can't begin to tell you the strength I've received from your love and care of me during those difficult times. I must also say that I've had the opportunity to work with amazing people on the staff, and the love and friendship and support they've given me through the years have also made it possible for me to be here today.

How very blessed I feel that God called me to Highland Park and I look forward to many more years together.

which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis.
