

Christmas Cantata & Plum Pudding Festival

A special day of music in and after worship

Advent season begins on December 2, and with it comes a beautiful set of Advent-themed music. Inspired by this year's theme "Share the Light of Christmas", our weekly advent music displays the joy of spreading God's love through song. One highlight of this year's Advent music comes from the Chancel Choir's Christmas Cantata, Sing Joy to all the World by Lloyd Larson. The melody from Larson's "The People Walking in Darkness" shows the "Sharing the Light" theme with the age-old text: "The people walking in darkness have seen a great Light!".

Another highlight of the service will be ending with the



classic "This Little Light of Mine" as an inspiration to go and share your light with the world throughout the Advent season.

During the December 16 service, the Chancel Choir will proudly present this year's Christmas Cantata: "Sing Joy to All the World" by Lloyd Larson. Many of the classic Christmas hymns you know and love are masterfully incorporated into Larson's own original composition. The driving opening movement calms into the soft, tender middle section of the cantata, which builds momentum until the final movement named after the title: "Sing Joy to all the World!" You won't want to miss this incredible performance by the HPBC Chancel Choir.

After worship on Dec. 16 our musical celebration will continue with our annual Plum Pudding Festival of zany, Christmas fun. Please bring a non-dessert

food to share, and join us in Sapp Hall for a potluck lunch, Christmas crafts and carols, and a parade of decadent desserts!

MEALS on WHEELS CENTRAL TEXAS





These activities are successful because YOU do your part in helping and contributing your time and money to help YOUR church carry out its mission to be God's people in this place—and outside these walls.


SNAPS FROM LAST MONTH
