#### From the Pastor's desk...

February 27, 2018

About four months ago I was approached by an organization called the Macedonian Ministry. They invited me to be a part of a group of pastors from the Austin and the surrounding area. I'll admit, at first I thought to myself, "I don't need another commitment to meet with ministers. I don't have enough time". But, after a brief discussion with a few other pastors from other parts of the U.S. who had been a part of this organization, I agreed to meet with them and hear what it was all about.



When I got the first packet in the mail here is what I saw:

Macedonian Ministry: Renewing Pastors, Transforming Congregations, Impacting Communities A church for Pastors: Our mission to renew pastors, transform congregations, and impact communities is ultimately rooted in God's mission to redeem the world through Jesus Christ. Our intention is that each pastor and congregation in the Macedonian program will come to the realization that they do not exist for themselves; they exist for the world!

That was enough for me to go to the first gathering to see what this was all about. We met at Servant Church in east Austin and there were pastors from San Antonio, New Braunfels, and Austin. They represented Presbyterians, United Methodist, UCC, Baptist (of varying types), and Episcopalian. This was an invitation-only meeting, so I was very honored to be selected to attend. From this meeting of about 18 pastors, 12 committed to be a part of the program.

Our commitment consists of one 4-hour meeting every month for three years, with a 2-day retreat at the beginning and a 2-day retreat at the end of the three years. In the middle of the three years, our entire group will travel to the Holy Land for 2 weeks, something I've always wanted to do. All of this is supported by the Macedonian Ministry: they do all of the fundraising for the speakers that come to our meeting, for the retreats, for the meals, and for the trip to the Holy Land.

This last week I attended the opening retreat. With a bit of hesitation as to what was ahead of me I traveled to Gruene, TX. When I arrived I began to get to know a few of the people in the group. Surprisingly our group is heavy on women pastors (only from Austin), so it was great fun meeting other women in Austin called to ministry. We then jumped into our program. WOW!!! That's the best way to describe it! It was not a fluff, surface-only, tell-us-about-yourself-and-your-ministry weekend. The theme was "Your Baptism" and we jumped in with serious studies of what our baptism meant for us and what other types of baptism also meant. By the second day, we had moved into discussion of our church's baptism: how we as a congregation remember our baptism, how we live our baptisms, how we honor one another's baptisms.

At the end of the retreat we experienced an anointing which was a very powerful moment for us all. It was a time of remembering, and also renewing, our call to ministry and renewing our commitment to our personal relationship with Christ.

By the end of the weekend I was spiritually filled and emotionally drained, but I also had developed an relationship with this amazing group of people, who not only do the same type of things I do in the church, but with a group of people who are praying for me, encouraging me and supporting me in my call. This group of people who allowed me to be vulnerable and were vulnerable with me.

I'm thankful to you for allowing me to become a part of this organization. I pray that it will not only impact me but will impact our congregation.

## PROGRESS IN PORT A

Weekend Mission Trip: Feb 23-25, 2018

Sixteen people from Highland Park, ages 9 to 77, gave their last weekend of February to help the people of Port Aransas, TX continue the work of recovery from Hurricane Harvey's devastating visit six months ago. Following this — our church's third wave of responding to the needs after Harvey — the work is far from being finished and neither are we. Here's a look at this latest adventure.

The fellowship hall at First Baptist Church Port A has been un-usable since August 26. Members of our crew spent Saturday organizing, both the kitchen and fellowship hall, sorting, moving all kinds of stuff, restocking shelves, washing countless dishes, pots and pans by hand, cleaning everything in sight, even the kitchen sink. The place looks new. Another crew removed piles upon piles of vinyl from a house hit hard by the storm. A third crew scraped up vinyl floor tiles, stuffed insulation between wall studs, hung drywall, and took down a ceiling fan in a beat-up office where much of the island repair work has been coordinated. In a short amount of time, much was accomplished by this hard-working team, who even found a bit of time to play at the beach.

Thank you to so many of YOU who gave generously to make this mission trip possible. Thanks to Cathy Glazener, Missions Ministry Leader on the Ministry Council, for so quickly leading us into this adventure. Thanks to Jody Harrison for multiple scouting trips to the coast; connecting us to the need there. Thanks also to Jim & Teresa Nuckols, Kathy Stanley & Eamon Neas, LaNell Coltharp, Jane Archer Feinstein, Edward & Alexander Rapier, Andrew Glazener & Tori Alexander and to Lori, Madison and Morgan Mitchell for your tireless, GOOD work and for Saturday night's group time.

Saturday evening, we gathered together for group time to share about the day, as we do on most of our mission trips. To tell stories. To thank God. To listen to each other. It, usually, is my favorite part of these adventures, hearing what God's been up to through us this day, sharing what we've noticed. Somehow my faith is strengthened and I feel more at home in my own life again — in a new way, more connected to the people around

me and to God. That happened again this time, thanks be to God and to you in that room, hearts so wide open to Love.

I hope to hear your voice one of these days as we gather again in a circle at the end of a good days work. I hope you'll know the deep joy of sharing like this with people at different places on their journey. The intergenerational nature of these adventures is profoundly heartening, maybe even a glance at God's kingdom. Highland Park, thanks for doing church like this. ## RECIPE

#### The Courage to Show Up

#### Live-stream of conversation between Brené Brown & Deray McKesson

On Feb. 1, a group of folks gathered in our fellowship hall to listen to an open talk between author/professor Brené Brown and teacher/activist Deray McKesson. Their conversation followed their healthy Twitter exchange last August, and was hosted at Riverside Church in NYC. The conversation was both warm and thought-provoking, and the speakers were both genuinely interested in one another's thoughts. They covered topics like privilege, interacting with those



unlike us, and how we might better practice listening to one another, but their time allotted to speak went too quickly. All in attendance were left wanting more.



Following the fascinating talk, the next most popular thing that night were Cheryl's "MONSTER Cookies". Maybe you can share a batch and a conversation with someone:

Combine the following in very large mixing bowl: 1 cup softened butter, 1 lb. brown sugar, 2 cups sugar, 6 eggs, 1 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract, 1 1/2 tsp. maple syrup, 4 tsp. baking soda, 1 1/2 cups peanut butter, 9 cups rolled oats, 1 lb. plain M&M's, 6 oz. chocolate chips

Drop by big spoonfuls onto greased or lined cookie sheets, and bake for 12 minutes at 350 degrees. Let cool slightly before removing from pan. Enjoy!



"I had no idea what to expect when I with walked into Sapp Hall. The promise of a challenging discussion about justice and equality drew me to the conversation. I thought we might get a "plan" to implement and change the societal ills we were seeing. Instead, the social worker and activist shined a light on much we didn't know about racism, inequality, being the privileged group and making our world more in Christ's image. And they didn't give us plan A or B. They left us struggling with "what do we do next?" And so we are."

"The conversation really made me think more about how I am empathizing with people and what I'm willing to do to understand experiences outside of my own. It was encouraging that we stuck around to talk about the conversation and discuss it. I think all of our biggest "to-do's" are to listen more and find ways to take action. Maybe Highland Park could host an event for the organization Interfaith Ministries of Central Texas, or the Austin YWCA chapter. One of my biggest takeaways from the live-stream was that while we might never truly understand what someone else has gone through in life, we all know what it's like to feel a wide range of emotions. Instead of comparing experiences, we are able to relate to people on emotional levels. The more group discussions we can have like this, the better we will be at listening. I think that's why I enjoy going to the SIS meetings as well - we learn about a diverse set of causes and ways to be involved."


