From the Tastor's desk...

There are so many times that I am proud that I pastor this church and that certainly includes the last few weeks. Things they are "a changin" around here and people are asking questions, and not always agreeing, but always showing love and respect. That's not always the way it works in the world.

Sadly we live in a world where many people seem to want their own way and aren't willing to

bend sometimes. They want to be comfortable with their own stuff, they want ownership and control, they want a voice and aren't always willing to listen to the voice of others.

Highland Park found ourselves in a bit of a bind. We don't have the membership to maintain this big building and this building is at an age where it requires a lot of maintaining. We found ourselves losing a tenant which meant more space not being utilized and even less money coming in to maintain the building. We were at a place of needing to bend a little. A facilities task force was appointed to look at what we could do to maintain the building while the church maintained their various ministries.

The Task Force was led by Kevin Mitchell and included David Balkum, Nancy Osgood, Mary Ellen Sullivan and Joe Stafford. Working with commercial realtor Brian Novy they found a solution to our problem. Paragon Prep, a private school in Austin became very interested in our space and a lot of it. After many long meetings, the Task Force presented Paragon Prep to the church and to the Ministry Council. There were lots of questions and lots of discussions, and in the end, the Council has voted unanimously to enter into a 10-year lease with Paragon Prep.

This does mean a lot of changes. Many of our groups that meet here may change rooms, we will need to clean out a lot of space, and we will need to relocate our youth. All of these things will take planning and work. Kelley and Kevin have been working on logistics and, as you can imagine, have their work cut out for them. We have a lot of furnishings that we will need to relocate, or perhaps donate, so please keep your eyes open if we make furniture available that you may want or know someone who might need.

This doesn't mean we can sit back and relax one our new tenant is here; we still need to be good stewards of what God has given us. The ministries of this church still depend on each one of us to continue giving in many ways. There will be much work that we can do together. I look forward to seeing ways we can continue grow and stretch in the years to come.

Thanks for allowing me to be your pastor and thanks for always making me a proud pastor!

IMPORTANT NOTICES

The Administration Ministry, upon the recommendation of the Facilities Task Force, has proposed that Highland Park Baptist Church enter into a ten (10) year lease with Paragon Preparatory School. Following an info session with both parties, a presentation of lease at the Ministry Council Meeting, and unanimous approval by the Ministry Council, the church and school will execute the lease in May.

The Bylaws Task Force has reviewed and is proposing changes to the HPBC Bylaws dated 11/28/2012. The Bylaws have been submitted to the Ministry Council for review and were approved at the Ministry Council meeting on April 28, 2019. The Church Moderator and member of the Bylaws Task Force, Don Dillard, will speak to the church after worship on Sunday, May 5 to address the proposed changes.

There will be a Quarterly Church Conference following the worship service on Sunday, May 12. The updated bylaws will be put up for a vote at this meeting, in addition to other business items.

At this time, the proposed changes are available to the congregation for review. In addition to being sent out by email, printed copies of both sets of Bylaws are available in the church office and on the Member Home section of the church website: <u>hpbcaustin.org/member-home.</u>
