From the Pastor's desk...

It was my amazing privilege to attend the 2018 Festival of Homiletics in Washington D.C. last week because it was a conference like no other. This being my second year to attend, I cannot even imagine how wonderful next year is going to be.



Last year, the festival was held in San Antonio and because of the closeness I felt I needed to give it a try. It was amazing to be right here in Texas and to hear some of the best preaching available in this country. Since Roy loves that kind of thing as much as I do, he registered to attend also so we could both actually sit in church together. We were really amazed at how much was offered. We struggled to hear everything and because we were not able to be in two places at once, we ended up only hearing about half of the speakers.

We arrived in Washington D.C. with an understanding of how it all worked and we felt like we knew what we were doing. This year, instead of two venues there were three so there was no way we were going to be able to hear all of the speakers. We sat down with our programs and tried to figure out who we wanted to hear and when and then finally decided we just needed to order the CD's of the programs so we could hear it all.

The opening Worship time was held at Washington's National Cathedral. We attended an Evensong, and then during Worship we heard Richard Rohr and Karoline Lewis speak. The service ended with communion and it was so unbelievably moving to watch preachers from all different faith traditions, from all over this world, take communion together.

Tuesday morning the Festival began with Walter Brueggemann preaching in the worship service and then lecturing the following hour. To say that we were able to hear some of my heroes in faith was an understatement. There were people, to be honest, I have not ever even heard of who were such powerful, moving speakers. I keep saying it was like trying to drink from a fire hose because that is simply the only fitting description.

I'm so thankful to Highland Park for allowing me the time and resources to attend this event and I'm already looking forward to next year's Festival in Minneapolis.

Micah 6 is looking to expand its services to the homeless young people it currently supports with its Sunday afternoon drop-in shelter, Friday evening home-cooked meal, and women's support group. After years of building relationships with some of these clients, **the Micah 6 director is passionate about trying to provide transitional housing.** The committee assisting him needs **advisors with residential rental property experience.** If that's you, and you would like to share your know-how in an occasional phone call, please contact Cathy Glazener.

The Micah 6 Food Pantry needs **12-15 people per shift to make the pantry run effectively** for the 250 people who depend on it to help feed their families every week. With UT students on summer break, **we can send a group of HPBCers to help fill some Saturday morning shifts** (9:00 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.). If you'd like to help, contact Cathy Glazener so she can organize teams for a day. To volunteer on your own, shifts are available on early Thursday mornings (6:00 - 8:00 a.m.), Thursday afternoons and evenings (3:00 - 5:00 p.m. and 5:00 - 8:00 p.m.), Friday mornings (10:00 - 11:00 a.m.), Saturday mornings (8:00 - 10:00 a.m.), and Saturday afternoons (9:00 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. and 11:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.). The pantry is located at University Presbyterian Church, 2203 San Antonio.

Look for a **new bookcase, easy to find in the atrium**, where you can drop off food donations any Sunday for the Micah 6 Food Pantry. Between deliveries to Micah 6, anyone who needs assistance can pick up from the bookcase. **If you see bare shelves, it's time to donate!**

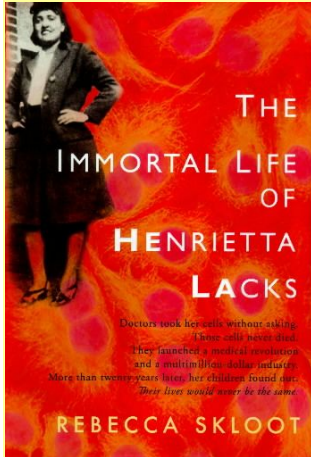

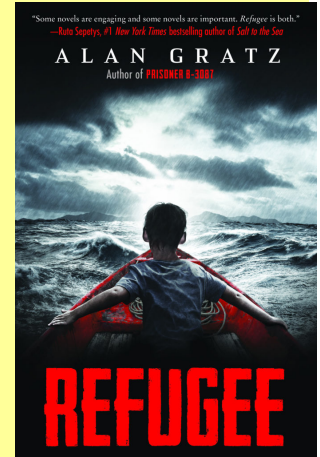
