

# From the Pastor's desk....

It is so difficult to exist in the world we live in today and not worry about so many things. We worry about our children at school, we worry about large gatherings of people and sadly, sometimes we worry about our church.



Recently, Nathan Thane, our Chair of Administration Ministry attended a workshop on how churches could deal with the fear of someone entering our building with the intent of causing harm. While I'm grateful for Nathan's willingness to attend this event, I'm saddened by the need to have such an event.

As a Council, both this year and last year, we have discussed how we want to deal with certain issues: the open carry law, the openness of our building (especially on Sundays), and what we feel like we need to do in order to educate our congregation.

We have made a few decisions. John, our Church Custodian, has been locking the downstairs doors and the back doors once Sunday School has ended. This limits people entering the building to only the two doors around the sanctuary. We also have posted signs at all doors stating we do not allow open carry in our building. This follows Austin Police Department's suggestions and allows them to respond if we notify them of a problem. These signs are worded, sized and mounted to the law's specifications. Lastly, one of the scheduled greeters will remain in the narthex during the service to remain aware of anyone entering the building.

While I know these things are hard to think about, the Council wanted you to know that they continually think about ways to be a church to one another, how to be a church open to everyone while being a place that feels safe and secure. Thanks again to Nathan for his willingness to think through these issues and thanks to the Council for making these decisions.

# SMOTTO A JARREFLE CTIONS Follow in the Mirror by Erin L. Randall

I was given the chance to be a sponsor for the four boys that attended Southwest Baptist Youth Camp from Highland Park, and it is safe to say that the week I spent at SWBYC was one for the books! The theme for the week was "Follow" and we spent our time exploring what it means to follow Christ's example of reckless love in a world where hate seems to be the easy answer. I had never been to Youth Camp before, so I was thankful that it was located at Schreiner University, my home for the last four years. It was an amazing experience getting to share that part of my life with our group from Highland Park.

Our days consisted of learning Christ's story through many different means, creating fellowship with people from all different backgrounds, worshiping our God in a space created entirely for us, and making memories that will last for years to come. The boys played many games of pool, dodgeball, and Tanner even came in second place during the ping pong tournament! I cannot put into words how it felt to watch the collective faith and fellowship of the group grow parallel to my own.

There were two parts of the week that really stuck out to me. First, during one bible study lesson, the youth were asked to identify something about their faith-walk that was hard for them – something that created space between themselves and Christ. I found myself searching the answer to that question in my own context. We spent the days prior learning about God's infinite love and it struck me as odd when I realized this concept was difficult for me to fathom. I have spent the last four years studying and learning about God's nature and overt willingness to live into a creation that has all but failed Him. I was not necessarily questioning God's love, but rather how God is capable of loving me, a beyond flawed human being, without abandon. How could anyone, let alone someone as awe-inspiring as God, love us so deeply when we fail them daily? Can you imagine the power of a love like that if it were to be shared without condition?

Another of my favorite moments from the week was an activity we did during worship Tuesday evening. We were all given a notecard and told to anonymously write on it a secret that we each held. We had to pinpoint

Once everyone finished writing, the notecards were turned in to the worship leaders and hung around the room. There was a somber and anticipatory mood that swept through the crowd when people realized exactly what was happening. This changed, though, and it was as if the room breathed a sigh of relief as we were

encouraged to travel around the room and read each other's hidden facets. In that moment, we all became aware of the fact that we were not alone in our obstacles. It occurred to me then that we are most capable of following Christ best amid adversity and setbacks, that we can use the overcoming of our "secrets" as proof of God's love in the world.

Spending a week at Southwest Baptist Youth Camp taught me an array of things. It set my heart on fire with an understanding of God that I did not previously carry. It encouraged me to live out Christ's love in the world while simultaneously understanding that my own setbacks have the power to launch me into a redeeming future if I live into them the way Christ lives into us. A big thank you to Cheryl, Kevin, and to Highland Park for allowing me the opportunity to attend Youth Camp!

# Updates From the Earth Covenant Ministry



Why is Highland Park Baptist Church a Green Neighborhood? Because one-third of our member households have completed the Green Neighbor Green City Challenge – a city of Austin program to help us reduce our carbon footprint, protect our natural resources, and reduce waste. Pick up a Green Neighbor Green City Challenge booklet upstairs just outside the office and join

the HPBC Green Neighborhood. HPBC is a Green Neighborhood inside the Green Neighborhood of Highland Park West and Balcones Area neighborhood.

Tip: Fertilize Wisely Reduce turf areas to use less water, fewer chemicals, and cut maintenance time; Don't Bag It! Leave grass clippings on the lawn to return nutrients and organic material to the soil; choose compost or natural/organic fertilizers that release slowly; never fertilize before a rain because rain can wash fertilizer from your lawn to a storm drain and into the nearest creek to cause excessive growth of algae and aquatic weeds.

Thanks to McCallum seniors Cash Robinson and Bodhi Tripathi for their drive-through hazardous materials collection in HPBC parking lot on June 9. A steady stream of neighbors dropped off paint, lightbulbs, cleaning supplies, and antifreeze, and Cash's parents Carolyn and Rhett Robinson made several trips to the City of Austin Recycle and Re-Use Center on Todd Lane.


