Our 5th Sunday Benevolence Offering on September 29 will go to "Explore Austin" which matches low-income, high potential "Explorers" with caring and committed adult mentors. Each summer, the middle school and high school explorers go on outdoor adventure trips with their mentors, and the kids learn leadership by taking on more and more responsibility for planning the trip as they get older.

In 2018, Explore Austin served 260 explorers and had 105 volunteer mentors. The long-term mentoring, social-emotional based curriculum, and leadership-based outdoor adventuring improve the well-being of all participants and aim to help the Explorers achieve their full potential. Kids eligible for free lunch at school or reduced cost lunch can apply for Explore Austin. Highland Park will collect donations for Explore Austin following worship on September 29.

NEWS FROM EARTH COVENANT MINISTRY

A part of the Missions Ministry

We are so fortunate that a Troop 410 scout put in a butterfly garden for us several years ago on the north side of our building around the corner from the Burchette Room's outside door. It was part of an Eagle Scout project, and now we're about to be the beneficiaries of another Eagle Scout project – this one a 300-gallon rain barrel snuggled up against the building about in the middle of the length of the garden.

We put 14 bags of mulch in the butterfly garden recently – free mulch from City of Austin's Recycle and Re-use Center on Todd Lane. Many thanks to Don Hartman for hauling the mulch in his pickup. We were some mulch-y folks after we finished filling 14 big cottonseed bags – another re-use from a deer hunter friend. And Don's willing to help with another load of mulch later this month so we can do the entire garden.

We have lots of mulch around the salvia now and with regular watering the 18 semi-new plants are showing some dark pink flowers. The butterflies won't be far behind, and we're aimed at certifying our garden through the North American Butterfly Association with our native caterpillar food plants – inland sea oats, fall asters, oaks, Texas Mountain laurel, redbud – and native butterfly nectar plants – salvia, asters, American beautyberry, turk's cap.

Our Styrofoam recycle bin is back, and in a new place on the side of the little building in back that is to the south of the stairs into the building. Put in your Styrofoam, close the lid with a hand on each corner so this one won't break, and LaNell Coltharp will make a run every month or so to City of Austin's Recycle and Reuse Center. We've let the neighborhood know we collect Styrofoam so we may be making more frequent runs and we may need more volunteer haulers.

Our tabletop recycling center is in the back hall past the office, where we collect batteries, eyeglasses, old cell phones, used up gift cards, and magazines. Everything gets a new life or a proper disposal – Dottie Denton takes the batteries to a drop-off, eyeglasses are reused, as are parts in the old cell phones, and gift cards are recycled by Earthworks into more gift cards. A marker collection box is in the nursery – toss in any brand of used up markers and Crayola will recycle them. And you can drop your used printer cartridges into the collection box in the office copier room. Just doing our part to keep things out of the landfill.




The church office and school will be closed **on Monday**, **September 2** for the Labor Day holiday. We wish you a restful day with family and friends.


