

# Plan to Walk On March 3 To help end hunger


Communities Responding to Overcome Poverty

CROP Hunger Walks help to support the overall ministry of Church World Service, especially grassroots, hunger-fighting development efforts around the world. CROP Hunger Walks help to provide food and water, as well as resources that empower people to meet their own needs. From seeds and tools, to wells and water systems, to technical training and micro-enterprise loans, the key is people working together to identify their own development priorities, their strengths and their needs–something CWS has learned through some 64 years of working in partnership around the world.

## **How Funds Are Used Locally**

One-fourth of the money raised in our CROP Hunger Walk is distributed to **local hunger-alleviating agencies** in the Austin area. The community is blessed by a variety of worthy hunger agencies. These local agencies were chosen by the local CROP Hunger Walk Team to receive funds in 2013:
