- Remodeling the new Youth Room continued in December and January, including removing a wall between two of the rooms alongside Sapp Hall, consolidating light switches, boarding up unnecessary doors, painting walls & ceilings, and laying laminate floors.
- Three new engraved brick pavers were installed in the Teague Chapel courtyard. Kelley DeCleene's father-in-law Mark, a former bricklayer, happened to come into town just in time to help us get them laid in the ground.





One thing that has been consistent across my faith journey is the impact of 'getting away' with fellow church members. I grew up doing that with Highland Park friends at children's camp, youth group and mission trips and continue that each summer at Leakey.

For the first time ever we decided to 'get away' with the 2020 Church Council to bond, worship and vision where Highland Park is headed in the next decade and beyond. The weather caused us to shift from an out-of-town ranch experience in Flatonia to the Burchette Room



but we achieved so much in the two days we spent together.

#### We talked about:

- how to provide worship, programs, education and experiences that provide more value and help our members (and future members) live more meaningful, impactful and fulfilling lives
- what the Church of the Future looks like and how Highland Park can be a major part of that equation
- how we can more authentically and magnetically represent the 'brand' of Highland Park
- how to re-energize our congregation by giving them something to talk about at Highland Park
- how to more effectively reach our neighborhood/community to truly be THE Church at Highland Park

I feel honored to have a chance to lead the 2020 Ministry Council and I can tell you that we have a group committed to making a tremendous impact on this church and this community in the year ahead.
