From the Pastor's desk...

Every year as we approach Lent, people begin talking about what they're going to give up for Lent. To be honest, until I reached my older years, I didn't even think about this because I wasn't raised with it being a part of my life. I've said before that it bothers me somewhat that people make such a big deal about what they're giving up. If you're getting "rewarded" by others for what you're giving up, then it's not as much a sacrifice as it's meant to be.



At our Council retreat, Walt Shelton challenged us to think about taking something on during Lent instead of giving something up. We've talked about this before but I really like the idea, especially this year, when we're looking towards ways to really grow together as a church.

Maybe for Lent you could find one person a day that you tell about Highland Park. Maybe you make a commitment to be at every worship service during Lent...even Ash Wednesday and Good Friday! Another good idea would be to spend some time each day reading scripture or praying. Last year I had a friend send me a card during this time; he said every day of Lent he was writing to people who had encouraged him through the years. Maybe you will become more aware of your own calling and gifts. Maybe you will become more comfortable sharing yourself with others. Maybe you will grow more committed to your calling. Hopefully we will all experience Christ deeper and more clearly this Lent as we journey with him to the cross and beyond!



FROM LAST MONTH


