One of the Boy Scouts of Troop 410 finished his Eagle Scout Project this month – installing a rain collection water tank near the butterfly garden on the north side of the Sanctuary. With the approval of Highland Park's Administration and Property Service Groups and with the helpful eye of Alana Mallard, McCallum High Senior Will Russo and his 13 volunteers, scouts and parents held two weekend workdays to remove and cut back a few plants, fashion a base, and install a large rain-collecting tank that will provide water to the area all year. Our thanks to Will for his work in fundraising, acquiring, and installing the tank in our garden.









The Church at Highland Park comes to the end of unusually challenging year with losses in rental income, a new website underway, and many requirements for changes and repairs to the building and upgrades to allow us to live stream our services with our financial health intact. Due to our loyal pledgers and some very generous gifts we have met all of our challenges.

Our total contributions are \$40,000 above our budget for the year and due to the reduction in Ministry spending, and even with all of the unscheduled repairs of HVAC, ramps, Website, name change costs, and live stream equipment, we have been able to increase the hours for our Youth Minister and yet maintain a surplus of \$18,536.23.

Since we are technically operating on an 18 month year, we have not worked on a budget since we are going to continue the current budget until June 2021 and hopefully will have a new council to consult with at that time.

The PPP loan remains unresolved, but the first loans have begun to go through the forgiveness process. We did not qualify at this time since we did not get our loan until May. We hope to hear from them in the next few weeks and will keep you informed.

I thank Church Bookkeeper Carolyn Doolittle for all of her expertise and the detail she provides on the reports she provides.


Celebrations during the time of COVID-19
