
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The Season of Lent begins on February 17 with Ash Wednesday. The church will host an outdoor Imposition of Ashes on February 17 at 5:30 p.m. as we look to begin our journey to the resurrection cross. You are invited to gather at the front of the property: you may remain parked in your car or find a lawn chair pre-set in socially-distant circles. Rev. Cheryl Kimble will deliver a homily & come to each group to place a sign of the cross on each person's forehead with ashes. If you do not feel comfortable receiving ashes, you may cross your arms in front of you, and the pastor will not approach you. Masks are required for all in attendance.

The season of Lent at Highland Park will feature special messages and music during worship and shared during the week online. I really can't believe it is already February... and I can't believe it's been 11 months since we had to shut down the building and change our service. I look back and think about all the times we'd pick a date out in front of us, thinking we'd be back together then. We first said "by Easter for sure" and here we are facing our second Easter in this pandemic. "Oh, we'll be together by summer" and then summer came and went with no camps, no VBS, no Mission trips. We had a beautiful outdoor Christmas Eve service but we still had to keep our distance from one another and then chose to go online again as numbers rose in our area.

Well, here we are in a new year. We knew it was going to be different, but it looks like we're still a bit away from being back together as normal. We have many hopes

It's been some time since I've seen many of you and I'd love to get an update on how you and your family are doing.

As we kick off 2021, I know as a congregation we have members juggling a lot of different emotions. Some are experiencing grief amidst the loss of friends and loved ones. Others are dealing with crippling stress as they juggle family, work, finances and other

responsibilities mid-pandemic. Some are just at a point where loneliness is the predominant feeling. If you fall in any of these categories please know you're not alone. You're a member of a community that loves you and that is here to support you as we all journey to the other side of this winter.

Thankfully, we also have many reasons for hope. New babies on the way. A vaccine that is starting to make its way to many of our members. Mission work ongoing. Innovative birthday celebrations, quarantine olympics, foosball training for the future camp champs and other signs of hope can be found across our membership on Facebook and beyond. Let's join together to rejoice in those and all of the other things Highland Park is doing to breathe hope into a trying time.

We may be physically dis-connected but our mission as a staff and council leadership team is to do everything we can to keep Highland Park spiritually connected and supported during this time.

With all of that said, I wanted to send out an early 2021 update to make sure everyone is up-to-speed on everything that is happening at Highland Park:

• Outdoor Services are Cancelled Until March - We had a lot of great momentum going with our outdoor services but the combination of rising numbers and falling temperatures caused us to cancel outdoor services in January & February. As of now, we're tentatively focused on trying to restart outdoor services March 7th, pending what local COVID numbers look like. Until then we'll continue to have virtual services & virtual Sunday School each week and appreciate any feedback you might have on how we can make these services even more valuable for you (What's working? What isn't working? How can these be most valuable for you?)

- Highland Park Financials To the surprise of no one, Nancy Osgood has done a tremendous job as finance chair for Highland Park in perhaps the most challenging year ever to be in that seat. She has sent a full report to the congregation (see pg. 7), and I wanted to let you know at a high level that the church was able to meet all of its obligations, from staff to missions and beyond, thanks to your consistent support throughout 2020. Thanks to that support and the ability to limit loss of rent revenue, Highland Park had a very solid year. Per the motion that passed in September of 2020, we're going to continue the first five months of 2021 with the 2020 budget still in place and will be creating a new budget alongside the start of the new fiscal and council year June 1, 2021.
- Forming a Nominating Committee There will be a Church Conference on Wed. February 3rd at 5 PM on Zoom to select a nominating committee for the new Church Council. We need your help in forming this committee - if you are willing to serve, we would sincerely appreciate you letting us know. If you have an idea for someone to serve, please speak to them and get their approval to nominate them ahead of that Feb 3rd church conference.
- Staff Retreat Our staff has done such a tremendous job leading our church through the pandemic and they deserve our utmost gratitude for all of their hard work. With so much work being done, it's helpful to take a step back and spend some time visioning toward the future, so we decided to organize a staff retreat (socially distanced and



outside) to review highs & lows of 2020, vision toward the future and make sure everyone is aligned as we prepare for post-pandemic Highland Park.

Please let me know if you have any questions at all. Additionally, if you have ideas or feedback on ways that we can best support you and your family to keep you spiritually connected during this time, please share those with me.

Year-End Report from Finance Ministry

The congregation of The Church at Highland Park has truly shown its commitment this year. Hours and sweat and tears were poured into preparing a budget for the year 2020 that would perform for all of our ministries and missions and prepare for the unexpected. But it was just impossible to envision how unexpected the year would be. In January we reexamined and found that we needed to invest in the future with a new website so that our congregation and anyone who was interested in our church could see all the gifts that we are sharing. Construction was already underway for the new Youth Area off of Sapp Hall and various building accommodations for our new main tenant Paragon Preparatory School.

In March, because of the pandemic, we had to close our in person Sunday service which was extended to include our special Holy week & Easter services. Paragon went to online learning and began planning which led to many more construction projects necessary for reopening with enough safety and space. Then Vacation Bible School, Children, Junior and High School camps, Intergenerational Mission Trip were all cancelled. This history sets the stage for my financial report for the last year.

In May, with the help of our accountant Carolyn Doolittle, we applied for and received a Paycheck Protection Program in the amount of \$86,182 to allow us to pay all of our employees until we were able to reopen. We were able to pay all of our employees including those paid by the hour such as Nursery workers and Custodian with these funds. These funds could also be used for other expenses such as utilities. There were some concerns about a drop in donations without the in-person services. Each month of this year has been very close to our projected budget of contributions or exceeded it.

Through the year although we were not spending on any of our budgeted ministry expenses, we had many unplanned expenses. There was a roof repair to the back building, an ADA accessible ramp for the back building, the replacement of a broken slide in the playground, lowering lease for Paragon, Legal fees for name change and lease adjustment, various HVAC repairs & replacements, equipment required to begin livestreaming, water damage from broken plumbing, and many smaller items.

This congregation found a way to keep on giving. Pledges were kept and very generous gifts were received all through the year to coincide with our greatest needs. Our contributions for the year were above our projections and this generosity allowed us to cover all of the expenses and missions. The Payroll Protection Plan loan is expected to be completely forgiven very soon.

We are asking that you continue to give as you are able and let us know if your pledge needs to be changed.

Missions News from Alana Mallard, Chair:





The Religious Coalition to Assist the Homeless, called RCAH, has not been on my radar until recently when I saw a year-end report about the grants RCAH made for 2020 to twenty-one local nonprofits who serve individuals and families living without homes. Among the 146 churches supporting RCAH is The Church at Highland Park, and we have supported the

group for more than 20 years by diverting our City of Austin drainage fee. RCAH grew from a bill passed by the Texas Legislature in 1996 and adopted by the City of Austin in 1997. Our agreement to divert our drainage payment to RCAH, means nearly \$10,000 towards the \$940,000 in grants made by RCAH in 2020. RCAH writes monthly checks to the nonprofits just as each church writes a monthly check to RCAH. Our drainage bill from COA this year was \$810 each month — and went to work toward housing and services needed by our vulnerable neighbors. It's not a dollar amount you see in our Missions budget, and it's important support for agencies such as Caritas, Casa Marianella, Front Steps, ECHO, Mobile Loaves and Fishes, SAFE Alliance, and many more.
