From the Pastor ...

Dear Highland Park,

We could not possibly know, one year ago, how long we would be going through this pandemic. We are so lucky that as a church we have been able to keep things going, including mission projects, virtual Sunday school hours, pre-recorded and livestream services, and even some outdoor in-person services. That has been 100% due to you: The Church @ Highland Park. You've continued to give, attend, and support everything we've done. I want to express my gratitude to you and ask for your help.

We made the decision toward the end of last year to make a change that we have been talking



about for years. We decided to make our church year - both fiscal and leadership go from June to May instead of January to December. This change was particularly important this year because we were not at a place in October to select a new Council or prepare a new budget. In the future this new schedule will help us plan during a time of year that's not so busy.

One reality of that fiscal year shift is that we kept last year's budget in place and asked our congregation to continue giving at 2020 levels to carry us to a new pledge drive, which will take place ahead of the launch of our new fiscal year June 1st.

What we need now from you as a congregation is:

 Please continue to support Highland Park as you are able and, if possible, at a level that equals your 2020 pledge so we can keep to the budget we have in place
 Be in prayer about what you might pledge to Highland Park for June 2021 through May 2022.


