As we move from Easter and the resurrection of Christ, I can't help but think about our church. We've been in a bit of a resurrection time! For 2 years every week we look at the number of people with Covid, we look at what level our city is in, we look at what the CDC recommends and then we decide do we have church this week. It feels like we have new life, new breath, new spirit.

Thanks be to God for The Church @ Highland Park and for all the "priest" who have given of their lives to make it the church it is today. I look forward to seeing how God will work through us in the next 70 years.




